Title 1 Program Participation

- Being a Title I school means receiving federal funding (Title I dollars) to supplement the school's existing programs. These dollars are used for:
 - Identifying students experiencing academic difficulties and providing timely assistance to help these students meet the State's challenging content standards.
 - Purchasing supplemental
 - Staff/Programs/Materials/Supplies
 - Conducting Parental Involvement
 - Meetings/Trainings/Activities
 - Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly Qualified Teacher

Title I, Part A Use of Funds

- Any (Local Education Agency) LEA with a Title I Allocation exceeding \$500,000 is required by law to set aside 1% of its Title I allocation for parental involvement.
- Of that 1%, 5% may be reserved at the LEA for system-wide initiatives related to parental involvement.
- The remaining 95% must be allocated to all Title I schools in the LEA. Therefore each Title I school receives its portion of the 95% to implement school-level parental involvement.
- You, as Title I parents, have the right to be involved in how this money is spent.

Title I, Part A Use of Funds

- The LEA Title I Plan addresses how the LEA will use Title I funds throughout the school system. Topics include:
 - Student academic assessments
 - Additional assistance provided to struggling students
 - Coordination and integration of federal funds and programs
 - School programs including migrant, pre-school, and supplemental educational services as applicable.
 - Parental Involvement Strategies, including the LEA Parental Involvement Plan
- You, as a Title I Parent, have a right to be involved in the development of the LEA Title I Plan

Parents' Right-to-Know

At the beginning of each school year, a local educational agency that receives Title I funds, shall notify parents of each student that they may request information regarding the professional qualifications of the students' classroom teachers including:

- If the teacher has met state qualifications and licensing
- If the teacher is under an emergency or other provisional status that has been waived
- If the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and their qualifications

Curriculum and Assessment

- Rice ISD currently implements the TEKS Resource System
 as our adopted curriculum. This system ensures that all state
 mandated TEKS (Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills) are
 being taught in each grade level and subject area.
- Academic assessments used to measure student progress include but are not limited to: STAAR, Unit Tests, mClass, DRA, and iStation.
- Due to COVID-19, Rice ISD did not receive an accountability rating for the 2019-2020 school year.
- The 2021-2022 accountability rating for Rice ISD was an "A".
